

One handed Typing – Use Sticky Keys

The one handed training programs assume that that sticky keys has been turned on, in order to speed up entry of capital letters and shifted punctuation. When sticky keys is turned on, it is not necessary to hold down the shift key while pressing another key. Instead, the shift key is pressed and released before pressing the other key. In Windows, sticky keys is enabled from the Accessibility Options control panel. On Mac OS X, sticky keys is enabled from the Universal Access item in the system preferences.

Students who do not use a standard Keyboard:

For students who use alternate input systems and/or specialized hardware and software – indicate the users alternative setup in the Custom Typing program. Using this setup Custom Typing also allows you to compare methods of input to find the most rapid and accurate text entry.
