9:10 AM	<p>ISBE Discipline Improvement Plan Progress Report 2023</p> <p>Notes: Our data is trending in the right direction. We are making more progress than other districts we often compare ourselves to. Most schools have already met their risk/ratio goal. Felicia and Carrie are meeting with principals regarding Tier I data. What families need support? What students need support? Partnering with Unified Insights to bring together data in one student level platform. Concerned about sunseting SWIS due to the level of reporting and analysis that SWIS is able to provide. SWIS has a data link function that will “talk” to PowerSchool to streamline data transfer. As an administrator, it is so important to know what a teacher has done to redirect student behavior before making a decision regarding next steps. Power School now has enhanced capabilities similar to SWIS. Staff have been meeting with our Data Administrator to build a D97 dashboard that encompasses elements of SWIS. Will be working with an external partner, MidWest PBIS to audit PBIS implementation. We have partnered with DePaul to have Care Coordinators in all 10 of our buildings. We have also partnered with The Oak Park Township to implement Girls on the Rise in our schools. CCC facilitate opt in Restorative Practice Cohorts to provide training on how to respond to student discipline with a restorative lens. Need to do more work on the intentionality of Tier I practices. This is based on classrooms observations done by Carrie and Felicia.</p> <p>D97 Board has asked questions about professional learning regarding implicit bias and teacher triggers in school discipline outcomes. This is in direct relation to the recent IGA with D97 and the Village of Oak Park.</p>	Dr. Carrie Kamm

9:30 AM	<p>Irving School Proposal</p> <p>Notes: PBIS team has reviewed SWIS data and noticed that there are students who have had multiple interventions but still need additional supports. One missing strategy was student mentoring. We are looking at implementing a program that partners older students with younger students. We will start small and work with student in our UDL Cohort. The program is centered on the principals of restorative practices. In the future we would like to set up field trips. There is an application process. The staff is excited about it. Salinas. The 4th and 5th grade students will name the program so they have ownership. The thee M's of the program are motivaiton, mindset and mentoring.</p> <p>Brooks has implemented an anchor mentor program.
