What You Should Know About iPad Rules that your child has already learned

iPads are school tools, not personal devices.

Anything a student is creating, playing, or viewing on their iPad should be directly related to an assignment or learning goal as approved by a teacher.

Transportation/Storage:

- iPads should be kept in the backpack from ringing of the bell to next destination.
- . iPads should never be out on the playground unless a teacher is asking them to use it.
- · iPad should have cover over screen whenever in transport

Who can use:

- Students should use for creating or viewing as directly related to a school assignment or ongoing learning as approved by a teacher.
- Parents are encouraged to monitor their child's device use; focusing on projects created, browser history, and photo library
- . Siblings and relatives should only admire from a distance

Settings

- . Lockscreen must have First name, Last Initial, Grade, and Homeroom Teacher.
- · Passcodes are not allowed on devices
- Students should not update operating system, apps, or settings without direction of the teacher.

Browsing:

- . Use the Library provided Tools and Research sections found on the District page
- . Do not use Google Search unless directed by a teacher (inappropriate)
- . Do not use YouTube unless directed by a teacher
- · Students should never clear history
- Students are invited to bookmark useful sites as recommended by their teachers

Image

- . Use Library Tools to find appropriate images licensed for you
- Do not search Google Images unless directed by a teacher
- Camera should only be used for school assignments. Students are not allowed to take selfies.
